You can understand why Kerry's struggling to hold onto hope right now... Kerry and her children have spent most of the pandemic in a single room at our Cloverhill family shelter. But that you are there — that you care — brings homeless mothers like Kerry more hope and comfort than you can ever know. Thank you...

ou would hear it instantly... as someone with so much compassion in your warm heart, you would hear the weariness in Kerry's voice as she tells you, "It's been really hard."

Some mothers who turn to Depaul's Homeless Family Services are fleeing domestic abuse. Others are victims of Ireland's housing crisis. But right now, all our parents are feeling the weight of homelessness like never before.


When coronavirus first knocked on our doors, Kerry and her three kids had already been homeless for two and a half years. But a year on homeschooling and lockdown after lockdown

— not having a home of their own is

taking a huge toll on the family. "The kids can't even go out and play," says Kerry. "My mental health has deteriorated during the pandemic, so has my children's."

'You lose your self-esteem'

You can understand why Kerry and other homeless parents are feeling low. Maura, the manager of Depaul's homeless family services, puts it like this — "Homelessness is so much more than losing your home... you lose your confidence, your self-esteem. It makes it hard to keep going."

But it's kindness and caring like yours that tells mother's like Kerry with no home you are not alone. And that, says Maura, "means more than you know."

Maura says that one of the biggest problems for homeless families in our care is homeschooling without the proper facilities and in such close confines. "The kids don't would mean the children could keep up with their schoolwork," says Maura, "and parents like Kerry could take classes and learn new skills to help them along on their path out of homelessness."

"I'd given up on life," says Jonny, speaking about his years of homelessness, loneliness, and addiction.

She had a similar story of trauma that led her down the dark path to homelessness and despair.

Studies show that many people struggle with mental health after becoming homeless. It takes just 90 days for your

mental health to decline.

Between **42% - 70%** of Depaul homeless service users have reported struggling with their mental health.

Self-harm among homeless people has increased by 72% over the past decade.

Still today, there is so much silence and stigma around mental health. That's why you, with your compassion and understanding, are so very treasured... Thank you!
