Your Love in Each and Every Step

On a freezing January morning, just before the pandemic began, Noel's front door clicked shut behind him for the very last time. And with that, at almost 70 years of age, his life as a homeless man began. Two years on, he wants to say thank you for caring about him, even when you faced hardships of your own. This is how your love stayed beside Noel each and every step of the way home...

"Then you're in it, being homeless seems impossible," says Noel. "It's only because I got through it that it seems ok now. But it really wasn't. It's like holding your breath. You can't breathe."

Noel is a man who loves a chat. For him, the loneliness and isolation that goes hand in hand with being homeless, was one of the hardest parts of the new reality he faced. "You feel like you're the only person on the planet," he says.

never say that before."

Being homeless is bad enough, but things were about to get even worse...

Just weeks later, the pandemic hit and the national lockdown began. You can imagine how scary and disorientating it was for poor Noel.

"I had a heart attack a few years ago and I have other health problems," says Noel. "I was so worried Covid was going to get me. I was thinking, if it catches me, it'll kill me."

"Knowing someone cared, it helped me to have hope," says Noel. "It made me think... I can get through this."

So far, your kindness has helped over 500 people escape the heartache of homelessness since the start of this pandemic.

And that's the aim... to get as many homeless people as we can through this crisis, and into safe homes of their own. Your kindness makes this work of the heart possible.

Thanks to you, Noel speaks to us from the little apartment he's proud to call 'home'.

If you could only talk to him, you would feel his gratitude in every word.

"I feel safe here," he says. "I wake up in the morning and

rehome his little dog, Rosie. He didn't want her to be homeless too. He misses her dearly. And he'd love to rescue another dog one day.

But for now, Noel is content to satisfy his nurturing spirit by caring for his neighbour, and the birds in his garden.

"I was given a bird feeder, and a fountain to keep them cool. The little birds come in and I love to watch them, noticing the different species. I've blocked off where the cats come in. I don't want them to

You don't need to be a doctor to know the struggles faced by homeless people — poverty, malnutrition, exposure — have a devastating impact on their health. Our new Clinical Nurse Manager, Ruth, speaks of her gratitude for your support through this pandemic and beyond...

The first thing many of our homeless patients confide to our nurses is the stigma they've felt accessing mainstream healthcare.

You can imagine how even one experience like this makes homeless people even less likely to seek the medical help they so badly need.

you're bridging the homeless healthcare gap.

"This is a place nursing is really needed," says Nurse Ruth. "If no one ever asks, 'are you feeling ok?'... you suffer in silence. Lots of the guys are afraid to go to hospital."

During the pandemic, your generous support of our nurses has been ever more important, says Nurse Ruth. "With the fear and anxiety of the pandemic, problems with mental health



have increased. I'm grateful to people who donate because it means we can give people specialist care right where they are."
