
Thank you for giving people a way back from homelessness and hopelessness —

Your Kindness Keeps Hope Alive

Terrifying. Horrific. Dehumanising. These are the words Martin uses when he describes his years as a homeless man. But after almost a decade of despair and too many freezing cold sleepless nights to count, Martin is home at last thanks to your kindness. And here he is with a message of gratitude for you...

s there a moment that a person becomes 'homeless'? For Martin, there was...

And even though he could see that moment coming down the tracks, closer and closer every day, he couldn't seem to stop it. "The

The struggle to survive

When you're homeless, the Irish winter is a war... a struggle to survive. Martin says that on the coldest days, he used to get on the bus just to stay warm. He'd wander around all night sometimes, too scared to sleep.

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physical toll it would take on you, can't you? Too worried to fall asleep in case you don't open your eyes again in the morning. It's a torture Martin knows all too well. There were times, Martin says, that he felt suicidal...

"I tried to take my life" twice when I was on the streets. I can't lie to you, there's no point in lying about it. That's what it does to you."

Your belief. Martin's gratitude...

When Martin turned to Depaul, he was frozen to the bone and at rock bottom.

But your kindness carries with it the power to turn a life around. To bring hope even to the most hopeless hearts. Because when you give, you're not *only*

providing the all-too-brief relief of a warm bed, clean clothes, and a belly full of food. Your generosity restores dignity, faith in humanity, and hope that faded long ago.

Your compassion gave Martin the courage to keep going. And he's forever grateful to you for believing in him, even when he didn't believe in himself...

"I had a horrible life until you guys stepped in. Depaul has changed my life. It's changed my family. It's changed everything. Without your help, I don't know if I'd even be alive. That's not being *dramatic* — *it's true!*"

"You wouldn't believe how incredible it feels to have front door keys," says Martin. "I haven't had keys for 9 years. It took me a few weeks to settle in. But now I love it. I can cook my own food, I have my own bed, and I don't wake up in fear anymore! I really thank you... I really, really do, from the bottom of my heart."

Meet Carrie. She's been homeless on and off since she was sixteen. But nine months after turning to Depaul, her future looks brighter than ever. Here's to Carrie's determination to change her life, to Depaul's women-only homeless services, and to <u>you</u>...

ast year, around a quarter of the people you helped through your kind support of Depaul, were women. And like a great many women who find themselves homeless, Carrie had a difficult childhood...

She started drinking at the age of nine. By twelve, she was addicted to drugs. But despite this, she holds no resentment in her heart for her rough start. "It wasn't my mother's fault," she says, "she didn't have a great life herself."

But it was when Carrie arrived at one of Depaul's six women-only homeless shelters, that her life began to turn around.



Carrie is profoundly grateful to you for the life-changing support she received at Depaul's homeless women's services. "There aren't enough places like Depaul," says Carrie, "there should be more services for women. I would have been back on the streets [otherwise]..."


