For many women in violent, abusive relationships that is the terrible choice they face. *That's how it was for Mary...*

For years she lived under the shadow of a violent man. "I didn't have control over anything. I had no money. I couldn't go anywhere. I lost my friends and family. I was completly isolated,"

But one day, Mary found the courage to leave with nothing but the clothes on her back. She managed to make her way to
